This program features two monumental works for organ. A transcription by Henri Messerer places a French Romantic lens on Bach's famous 'Chaconne' originally for solo violin. Following this, you will hear Franz Liszt's dramatic Variations on "Weinen, Klagen, Sorgen, Zagen" that he composed using a chromatic bass line from Bach's 'Cantata BWV 12'. Both of these works showcase the full extent of the organ's timbral possibilities.

Program

1. Chaconne from Partita d-minor BWV 1004 transcribed by Henri Messerer (1838 – 1923)

Johann Sebastian Bach (1685 – 1750)

2. Variations on "Weinen, Klagen, Sorgen, Zagen" (Weeping, lamentation, worry, apprehension)

Franz Liszt (1811 – 1886)

Drum laß ich ihn nur walten.


therefore I let only him rule over me.

Biographies

Holly Broadbent (organ)

Holly is currently studying a Master of Music degree specialising in organ performance at Yale University. Following her first year at Yale, she recently received the Charles Ives Prize that is annually presented to an outstanding organ major.





Previously Holly held organ posts at St. George's Cathedral, Swanbourne Anglican Church, and Wesley Uniting Church.

Holly also holds an undergraduate degree in composition from the University of Western Australia and Honours (First Class) in organ performance from WAAPA where she studied under Alessandro Pittorino and Stewart Smith.

Prior to studying at Yale, Holly gained her qualification of ARCO (Associate of the Royal College of Organists) and travelled to America after being selected to work with Juilliard's Organ Professor, Paul Jacobs, as part of the Oregon Bach Festival. In addition, she travelled to Sydney to perform with the Australian Youth Orchestra under the baton of Sir Mark Elder and also competed as a finalist in the Sydney International Organ Competition for which she was a prize winner.


